Trumbull

According to Glasgow, "Charles De Witt Trumbull[, the son of] John K. and Laura A. (Dunbar) Trumbull, was born in East Craftsbury, Orleans County, Vermont, April 4, 1837." However, Mr. Robert More, of Waddington, NY, owns photocopies of the Craftsbury church records, one page of which seems to indicate that Mr. Trumbull's birth date was January 18, 1837. At my request, Mr. More's daughter, Miss Sarah More, sent me a photocopy of the relevant page.

Looking on the Internet, I found the website of a church that was once the Craftsbury RP Church. A man there, Mr. Bruce Shields, helped me to contact a lady, Mrs. Susan Trumbull, who has done much genealogical work on her husband's family.

Since I began investigating this problem, she has told me of several relevant sources supporting the April date. They include: an Album of Des Moines County, Iowa, published in 1888, at which time Mr. Trumbull lived there; a genealogical table attributed to Mr. Trumbull's daughter; and Mr. Trumbull's gravestone. All of these offer simple, unambiguous evidence.

Against these data, I found only two pieces of evidence to support a January date: the Craftsbury records; and the Rev. Owen F. Thompson's *Sketches of the Ministers*, which gives sketches similar to Glasgow's for ministers from 1888 to 1930. On pages 341-342 of his book, Mr. Thompson says that Mr. Trumbull died on January 21, 1914, at the age of 77; had he been born in April, he would only have been 76. The register from Craftsbury is somewhat obscure, although one can still read "Charles Dewitt of J. H. [or K.] Trumbull," besides the date of "Jan 18 1837." Mr. More believes it to be a record of baptisms, although I think that it records births; January 18 was a Wednesday, and April 4 was a Tuesday.

Besides this, one may argue that Glasgow would have been able to speak with Mr. Trumbull, who surely would remember his own birth date; of course, one might also argue that Mr. Thompson would have known Mr. Trumbull. As well, this register lists "John Cargill of Jas Turnbull 2d" on April 4, 1838. The page lists dates in good order, and two names separate John Turnbull and Charles Trumbull. Could Glasgow have confused these two names?

Despite all of the evidence for the April date, I favor the January date, since it is supported by the only surviving (to my knowledge) primary source. However, as so many other sources disagree, I have listed both in the online text.
